## No. 02 – Encourage Reading Across All Ages



Student Lit Day for High School Students and Young Authors Conference for Elementary and Middle School students saw vibrant participation in 2023.

Seventeen schools participated in Buckeye Book Fair events. They were: Ashland City School District, Wooster City School District, Triway Jr High, Triway High School, Wooster Township Elementary, Shreve Elementary, West Holmes Middle School, Holmesville Elementary, Fredericksburg Elementary, Mount Eaton Elementary, John R. Lea School, Apple Creek Elementary School and Cloverleaf Local School District.



The Buckeye Book Crawl was an extraordinary journey that catered to every literary taste. Our diverse lineup included a captivating sports panel, a rendezvous with romance novelists, a dive into the world of graphic comics, and something special for history buffs. As participants explored the vibrant streets of downtown Wooster, they discovered signature drinks and unlocked hidden gems using exclusive passwords. This unique experience merged literature, culture, and excitement, making the Buckeye Book Crawl an event to remember. Highlights included book signings with authors like Mindy McGinnis, Annie Hunter Eriksen, and Anastasia Hastings, as well as engaging panels and thrilling activities. ## No. 03 – Recruit Volunteers from Various Generations



## No. 05 – Inform and Inspire Ohio Heritage + Pride

The Buckeye Book Fair not only celebrated literature but also played a crucial role in informing and inspiring Ohio heritage and pride. Our events facilitated meaningful collaborations with esteemed organizations such as the Ohio Genealogical Society and Ohioana Book Library, enriching the festival with presentations that delved into the heart of Ohio's history and culture. Notable presentations included Connie Bernstein Dow's "Tap and Rap, Move and Groove," which highlighted the joy of movement, and Governor Richard F. Celeste's "In the Heart of Ohio," which provided profound insights into Ohio's rich heritage.

Engaging workshops like "Young Voice, Bold Choices" for young adult authors were particularly impactful, fostering creativity and laughter among participants. David Goodrich's "On Freedom Road" captivated attendees as he shared his remarkable journey on the Underground Railroad by bicycle, offering a unique perspective on this significant historical pathway. Additionally, Timothy G. Anderson's "Settling Ohio, First Peoples and Beyond" was a top-selling book, reflecting the keen interest in Ohio's early history.

Our events attracted over 1,200 attendees, with the book crawl and author talks generating substantial interest. Presentations by authors like Mindy McGinnis and Annie Hunter Eriksen, along with a sports panel discussion, were particularly well-received, drawing diverse audiences and fostering a deeper appreciation for Ohio's literary and cultural heritage. Through these enriching experiences, the Buckeye Book Fair succeeded in inspiring pride and a profound connection to Ohio's history and community.

## No. 06 – Extending Engagement Beyond the Festival

Beyond the annual book festival, the Buckeye Book Fair is dedicated to promoting literacy and fostering a love for reading throughout the year. We host a variety of literary programs, including the Student Lit Day for high schoolers, the Young Authors Conference for 3rd through 8th graders, and the Buckeye Book Camp for young writers and illustrators over the summer. Additionally, we offer discounted books for teachers and librarians, and organize events such as the Buckeye Book Crawl and literacy awards. Through these initiatives, we aim to support both emerging and established authors while enriching the literary community in Ohio.

- The Buckeye Book Bits Newsletter received a much-needed update, now released monthly 202400 readers has a goal of reaching 3,000 readers by the end of 2024.



- The live performance art of the Dear Vaccine book of poetry through Kent State Press and Ohio Arts Council performed in collaboration with Wayne Center for the Arts.

# EXPANDING SERVICES BASED ON FEEDBACK

Feedback from attendees, volunteers, and authors was instrumental in shaping our initiatives:

- Attendees suggested improved signage and clearer entry points, which we will implement in future events.
- We received overwhelmingly positive feedback, with participants enjoying meeting authors, discovering new books, and attending talks.

In response, we are introducing a Buckeye Book Camp over the summer to expand enthusiasm and writing opportunities leading up to the festival.

## Event Data and Metrics

- Overall Attendance: Approximately 8,500 participants attended events, engaged with outreach programming, and read newsletters.
- Books Sold: 3,436 books were sold, with over 112 authors and illustrators participating.
- Geographical Reach: We attracted attendees from over 26 different cities, including some from out of state.
- New and Returning Participants: About 30% were first-time attendees, and around 50% were regular participants.

## Social Media Engagement:

- Facebook: Reached 43,890 users, with 8,574 visits and 189 new followers, totaling 1,768 followers.
- Instagram: Reached 1,216 users, with 804 visits and 135 new followers, totaling 632 followers.
- Twitter: Gained 131 followers swiftly after we started it.
- YouTube: Despite having only a few 100 subscribers, our engagement statistics were over 23.5K minutes watched
- TikTok: Already has 38 followers, showcasing growth despite being a new platform.



The rising costs in the book industry have posed significant financial challenges for the Buckeye Book Fair. Despite our efforts to balance expenses and income, the increasing prices of materials, production, and logistics have strained our budget. For instance, in 2022, our expenses soared to \$118,586 while our income was \$83,198, creating a substantial gap. Although we saw a positive turn in 2023 with an income of \$118,899 against expenses of \$99,497, the need for increased sponsorship remains critical. To continue providing valuable literary programs and events, we rely on the generous support of sponsors to bridge these financial gaps and ensure the Buckeye Book Fair's sustainability and growth.
